


The University of Sydney Library Strategy

University Librarian's Foreword



The development of a new strategy for the University Library is timely. The previous library strategy expired and the University of Sydney has set a bold new vision for the next 10 years in its *Sydney in 2032* strategy. The library is eager to play a vital role in delivering the university strategy. Common themes in the two strategies are mapped visually later in this document.

As the library for Australia's first university, we have a long and rich heritage. This library has always been at the heart of the university and its community with an innovative approach to service. We were the first library in Australia to implement the Dewey Decimal classification. The original Fisher Library was an architectural gem that incorporated an early book lift and a fireproof stack inspired by the Library of Congress. This library was an early player in automation and digital humanities. 2023 marks 60 years since the commencement of services in the mid-century modern incarnation of Fisher Library.

The COVID-19 pandemic forced us to vary our service offering at short notice. We extended our considerable online collections, improvised new online service models while maintaining essential physical services for students with no alternatives. The pandemic was a game changer for our academic community, open access research accelerated the scientific response to the medical emergency, and new teaching and learning opportunities challenged teachers and students alike.

Our library staff were flexible and resilient, took on new roles and responsibilities and implemented different models of service delivery. The human challenges of the time prompted us to revisit our values and priorities in a thoughtful way.

With the pandemic and a nascent university strategy, the library embarked on a collaborative approach to developing a new strategy. This document includes feedback from many interactions inside and outside the library to ensure a client-centric approach. We were fortunate to involve a senior colleague from Ithaka S+R, a New York based not-for-profit that had recently researched the strategic intentions of senior academic officers in more than 60 research intensive universities and their libraries in USA and Canada.

I would like to record my thanks to the many staff, students and stakeholders of the university who contributed to this new strategy development. I am indebted to the goodwill, creativity and heartfelt response of staff across the University Library. They collaboratively built this new strategy to guide the next exciting era in our rich history.







The process has involved multiple engagements with stakeholders including Library staff across all areas and levels, students at various stages of their education, researchers, academic partners from across the University, alumni, community members and the Friends of the Library.

The feedback and inspirational ideas gathered from Library's diverse communities have enriched the overall strategy. The strategy has been shaped by the priorities articulated in the University's 2032 strategy and informed by trends identified in environmental scans.

The Library will continue to consult and adapt as we develop our supporting 3-year plans.
